



CUB SCOUT CODE OF CONDUCT

Cub Scouts, parents, leaders, and organizations work together to achieve the 10 purposes of Cub Scouting:

1. Character Development
2. Spiritual Growth
3. Good Citizenship
4. Sportsmanship and Fitness
5. Family Understanding
6. Respectful Relationships
7. Personal Achievement
8. Friendly Service
9. Fun and Adventure
10. Preparation for Boy Scouts

With these in mind, we expect each Cub Scout to behave in a manner that fosters this development.

- ✓ We expect that each scout be respectful of his leader and others. This includes following instruction and being quiet and paying attention when others are talking.
- ✓ Every scout should be on time and in uniform* for den/pack meetings. Prior to leaving the meeting, each scout should (1) help clean up the meeting room, (2) make sure that he has all of his belongings and (3) thank the leaders.
- ✓ Each scout should act as an example for the younger scouts in the room. He should take pride and demonstrate the scouting behavior that he had learned over the years.

* Uniforms are an important part of the Scouting program. The Cub Scout uniform includes the blue shirt, den specific neckerchief, slide and cap. The Scout should have the shirt buttoned and tucked in. The Scout should wear appropriate pants with his uniform shirt. The blue in the uniform stands for truth and spirituality, steadfast loyalty, and the sky above. Gold stands for warm sunlight, good cheer, and happiness. When the scout wears his uniform, people will know that he is trying to be good and helpful. This should be worn at Den meetings, Pack Nights and other Scouting events when appropriate.
