

Pack 72 Policy – Uniform

Why a Uniform

As Scouts we wear a uniform to show respect to the Scouting organization and to show our pride in ourselves and the organization. Wear the uniform proudly and correctly.

Proper placement of the insignia on the uniform can be found on the Pack website in the “Parents” section under “Key Pack Information” and titled “Uniform Insignia Placement”.

Classes of Uniform/ When to Wear

While the uniform should be “uniform”, there should be allowances as to circumstance as to the “class of uniform” worn by function and occasion.

- **Class A**
 - Special occasions and when in the full public view such as parades.
 - Blue and Gold banquet.
 - For this very special occasion for the Pack, awarded medals to the boy or adult such as God and Country or Eagle can and should be worn appropriately on the uniform. Medals are to be worn pinned slightly above the left pocket flap.
 - Den and Pack meetings.
 - On campouts as required by Pack leadership.
- **Class B**
 - Campouts and Day camp or similar as suggested by the Pack

Cub Uniform

The Cub uniform is the standard Blue uniform and rank specific accessories. It is worn by Tigers, Wolves, and Bear level Cubs.

Class A

- Shirt – Cub shirt, with proper insignia sown on and buttons properly buttoned. Shirt tucked into pants.
- Cap – proper cap for the rank
- Neckerchief – proper neckerchief for the rank with proper slide for the rank. Neckerchief to be worn under the shirt collar and rolled so as to fit through the slide
- Belt – official Cub belt
- Pants – blue jeans or similar blue pants. NO SWEAT PANTS.
- Socks – white socks worn for sneakers.
- Shoes – sneakers or similar, can be hiking boots but must be clean

Class B

- Shirt – Pack tee shirt
- Belt - official Cub belt
- Pants – blue jeans or similar blue pants. NO SWEAT PANTS.
- Socks – white socks worn for sneakers.
- Shoes – sneakers or similar, can be hiking boots but must be clean

Webelos Uniform

A Webelos Scout is on the road to being a Boy Scout and much of the achievement is focused on that. For that reason the Webelos Scout Den typically utilizes the Webelos uniform closely matched to the Boy Scout uniform.

The boys should move to the Webelos uniform after the late Spring cross-over from Bear to Webelos Den level.

Class A

- Shirt – Scout Tan shirt, with proper insignia sown on and buttons properly buttoned. Blue epilate tabs on the shoulders. Shirt tucked into pants.
- Cap – proper cap for Webelos
- Neckerchief – proper neckerchief for Webelos with proper slide for the rank. Neckerchief to be worn under the shirt collar and rolled so as to fit through the slide
- Belt – official Cub Scout blue belt (Scout green belt cannot accept Belt Loop awards)
- Pants – blue jeans. NO SWEAT PANTS
- Socks – white socks worn for sneakers.
- Shoes – sneakers or similar, can be hiking boots but must be clean

Class B

- Shirt – Pack tee shirt
- Belt – official Cub Scout blue belt
- Pants – blue jeans. NO SWEAT PANTS.
- Socks – white socks worn for sneakers.
- Shoes – sneakers or similar, can be hiking boots but must be clean

Adult Leader Uniform

The leadership of the Pack should set the proper tone and example for the boys. The most visible sign of that is the uniform. The leadership consists of the Cub Master, Assistant Cub Master, and at least the Den Leaders. Assistant Den Leaders and Committee Members have an option to wear the uniform or “civilian” clothing.

The general statement concerning “Class A” and “Class B” uniform from the “Classes of Uniform/ When to Wear” section should apply to the Adult uniform as well.

Class A

- Shirt – Scouting tan shirt with blue epilate tabs. Proper insignia sewn on except for temporary patches on the right pocket via a button loop attachment.
- Pants – Blue jeans or official Adult Scout olive pants/ switchback pants.
- Belt – Scout green belt or national BSA recognized belt and buckle (Philmont, National Jamboree, etc)
- Socks – Scout socks or dark socks
- Shoes – Leather shoes or can be hiking or similar boots.
- Neckerchief – Pack 72 does not typically wear neckerchiefs. Special neckerchiefs (Wood Badge, Philmont, etc) could be worn on special occasions.

Class B

- Shirt – Pack tee shirt
- Pants – blue jeans or similar
- Belt – Scout belt or national BSA recognized belt and buckle
- Socks – as determined by footwear
- Shoes – leather shoes, boots, or sneakers
