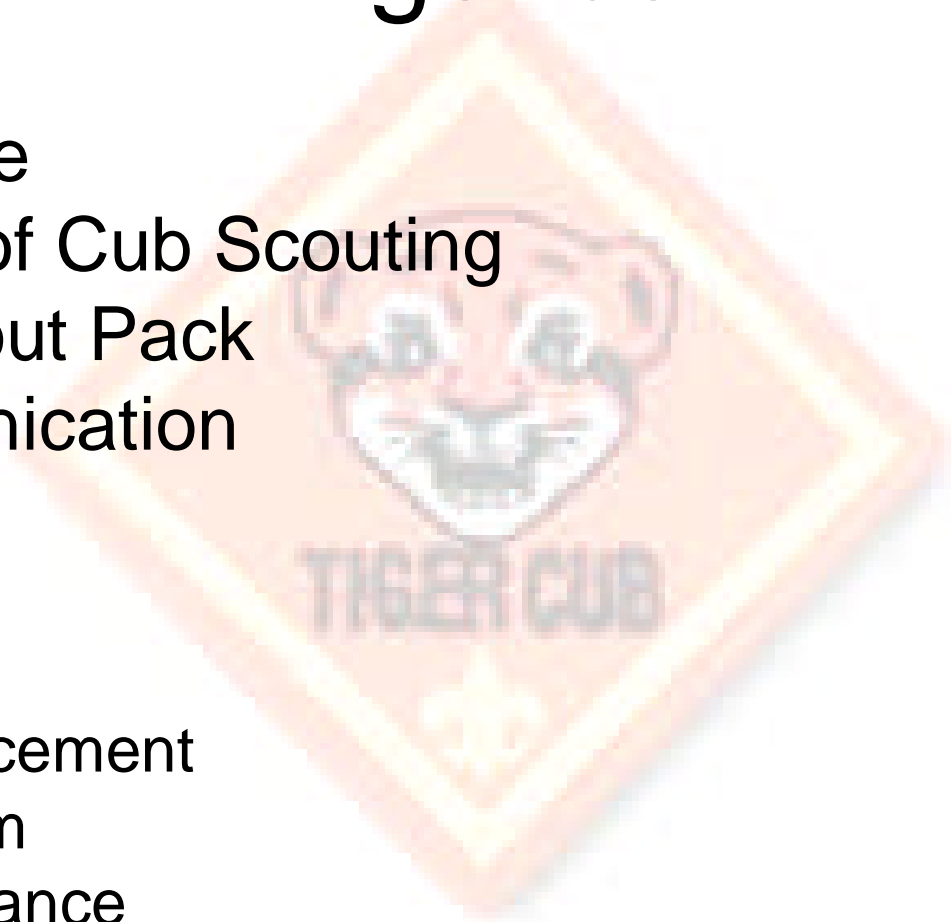

History of Cub Scouting

- 1910 Boy Scouts of America incorporated on February 8
- 1916, Sir Robert Baden-Powell introduced the "Wolf Cub" program for younger boys.
- 1920 The first National Training Conference for Executives emphasized the need for a younger boy program.
- 1924 The national Executive Board proposes the "adoption of a younger boy program at the earliest date, should be kept entirely distinct from Scouting, should prepare for graduation into the Scout movement."

History of Cub Scouting

- 1927 A portion of a Laura Spelman Rockefeller grant of \$50,000 supported research and development project on the younger boy program.
- 1929 Demonstration Cub units were approved by the national Executive Board.
- 1930 The national Executive Board heard the Hurt committee Report and approved the Cub program "controlled experiment" as of February 10.

History of Cub Scouting

- 1931 At the end of the second year 25,662 boys were registered in Cub packs in 258 councils across the nation with 5,228 registered pack leaders.
- 1933 "Experimental" restrictions were removed as of May 25th; Cubbing to be "aggressively promoted as a part of the Boy Scout program."
- 1934 Cubbing had 64,739 boys and 8,269 leaders registered during the fifth year.

History of Cub Scouting

- 1939 Cubbing Guidebook and new manual for den mother training were produced.
- 1941 The Webelos rank was created for 11-1/2-year-old boys with the Lion badge. Accumulated badges could be worn on uniforms.
- 1943 First blue and gold banquet. Packs sell War Bonds and War Stamps. During the year 442,853 boys and 80,458 leaders were registered in the program.

History of Cub Scouting

- 1945 "Cubbing" changed to "Cub Scouting."
Registrations: 695,014 boys and 141,468 leaders.
- 1951 The Wolf Book was revised to the reading level of the 8-year-old boy.
- 1953 First 'un-official' Pinewood Derby run on May 15 by Pack 280c
- 1955 'Official' Pinewood Derbies introduced.

History of Cub Scouting

- 1967 The Cub Scout Advancement Program was overhauled. The Lion rank was discontinued in favor of the new Webelos Scout program with its distinctive uniform and 15 activity badges.
- 1969 First women were appointed to the national Cub Scout Committee. Total registrations in Cub Scouting hovered just short of five million people 3,602,688 boys and 1,284,363 pack leaders.

History of Cub Scouting

- 1978 Five ranks established for Cub Scouting: Bobcat, Wolf, Bear, Webelos, Arrow of Light.
- 1980 The 50th anniversary of Cub Scouting in the United States.
- 1982 The 75th anniversary of World Scouting. Tiger Cubs, BSA, was introduced
- 1985 The 75th anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America; 55th anniversary of Cub Scouting.

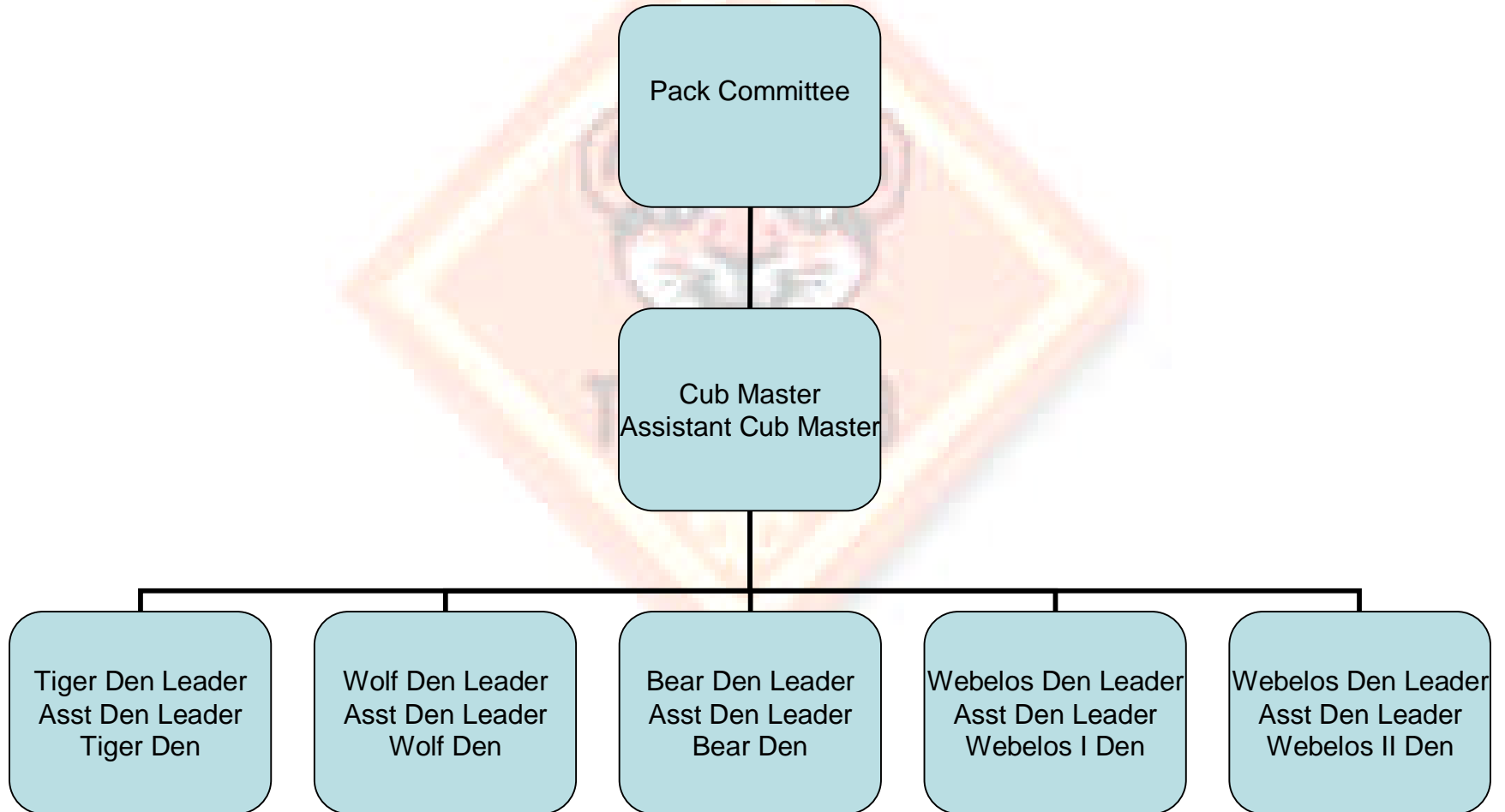
History of Cub Scouting

- 1986 Boy Scouts of America took a new and dramatic step to serve boys in all school grades. Membership requirements for Tiger Cubs and Cub Scouts became primarily based on grade in school, rather than age.
- The plan was expanded to included first-grade boys as Tiger Cubs and second-grade boys as Wolf Cub Scouts.
- 1998 Cub Scouting membership - Tiger Cubs, Cub Scouts, and Webelos Scouts - grew to more than 2.17 million.
- And here we are now!!!

Cub Scout Pack

- Pack is the overall “local” organization
- Pack 72 typically meets 3rd Friday of the month, September through May (but check the calendar on our website www.libertyvillepack72.com)
- Made up of “Dens”
 - Tiger – 1st grade
 - Wolf – 2nd grade
 - Bear – 3rd grade
 - Webelos I – 4th grade
 - Webelos II – 5th grade (and thus to Boy Scouts)

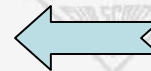

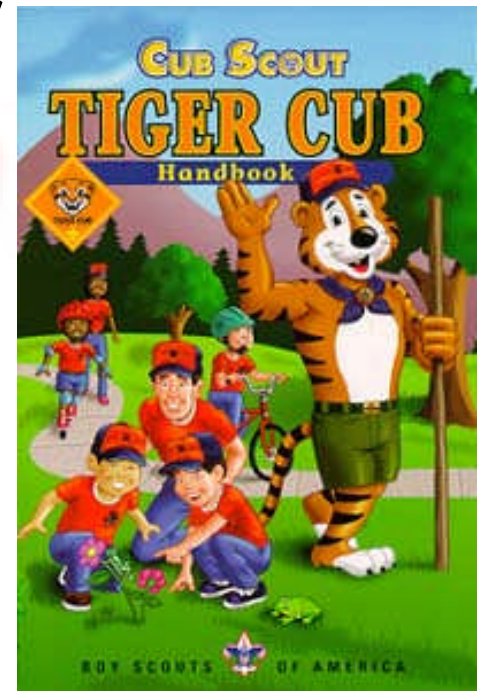
Tiger – Book

Tiger – Den

- Begins to meet in October going through May
- Typically meets twice a month
- Most advancement and activities with Den
- Parent/ boy teams
- Den Leader works with Parents to put on meetings (shared leadership)
 - Each month, one parent helps Den Leader plan and execute meetings
- Den Leader “buddy” – a former Tiger Den Leader

Tiger – Advancement

Key Points

- Five requirements
- Each requirement made up of:
 - Family Activity
 - Den Activity
 - Go See It!
- Instant recognition bead for each sub-requirement

Being a part of Scouting and the Pack

- Pack requirements:
 - Cub Scout uniform shirt with proper insignia and patches
 - Tiger Cub Scout hat
 - Tiger neckerchief and neckerchief slide
 - Blue jeans or blue slacks – obviously official Cub Scout pants would be the preferred uniform component, but with rapidly growing Cub Scouts, buying Cub Scout pants yearly or more can be impractical.
 - Shoes and socks
- Tigers are Orange

Tiger - Attendance

Not required – HOWEVER

- Tiger advancement is primarily through Den activities
- You miss a Den activity and you must typically do the activity yourself
- Key to Scouting is involvement
